Accredited Urban Design Degrees and Courses

The list of accredited Urban Design courses and degrees is used as a guide when evaluating members for the **Professional Membership** category only. This list represents courses already approved by the membership committee of UDISA and in no way excludes any other bona fide Urban Design Course. Should your course not reflect on the list below, an application for accreditation of the course must be appended to your membership application. UDISA's Steering Committee will make the final decision on eligibility.

The two criteria that the course under review must meet are:

- ➔ That it must have a significant studio component to the course and
- ➔ That the course must be a minimum of one year in duration.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to provide all the necessary supporting documentation, including curriculum details, the university it is offered at and a certified copy of the degree obtained. The membership committee reserves the right to make the final decision on whether a course meets its eligibility criteria.
